# **Emergency cooking equipment ideas**

## **Volcano Grill – 3-fuel Portable Camping Stove**

Fuel: wood, charcoal, or liquefied petroleum gas

Price: \$199, find on amazon.com, Walmart, or volcanogrills.com

## **Scout Stoves**

Fuel: varies – butane, isobutane, liquefied petroleum gas

Price: \$20 - \$50, shop Recreation Outlet for a decent variety

### Joyesy rocket stove

Fuel: wood

Price: \$40 on amazon.com

### Thermal Cooker

Requires an initial quick boil over the stove then cooks without fuel

Price: \$150 – clankitchen.com or saratogajacks.com (Utah company)

### **Portable Butane Stove**

**Fuel: Butane canister** 

Price: \$25 - \$48 on amazon.com or at Recreation Outlet

#### Toilet Paper in a can

**Fuel: Rubbing alcohol** 

**Price: \$5 - \$10** 

Fill a new, <u>empty quart tin can</u> with a <u>roll of toilet paper</u>, with the center carboard roll pulled out (squeeze to fit it in the can). Pour in <u>1 pint rubbing alcohol</u> and put inside an <u>empty gallon size paint can</u> with holes punched in the lower part for air to circulate. Light it. Use a small grill on top and set the frying pan or pot on top of the gallon can. When the flame goes out, just add more rubbing alcohol. Store with lid with the TP and alcohol still in the can. This has one heat setting and it's HOT!

#### Paper Box Oven

**Fuel: Charcoal** 

Price: \$10 for bag of briquettes, \$6 for foil – other supplies on hand

Wrap the inside and outside of a <u>paper ream box with aluminum foil, including the removable lid</u>. Set a metal cooling rack on the bottom of the box. Fill the box with <u>heated briquettes</u> (each briquette heats the oven 25 degrees (10 briquettes to reach 350 degrees). The heat remains stable for about 20 min.
